This half term in English we are focussing on a fiction unit where we will read short stories by the same author then write our own fiction story. We will also be looking at comprehension skills, role play and spelling, grammar and punctuation key skills (SPaG).

Curriculum Overview - Summer Term 1



Science

We are learning about plants this half term, including what plants need to grow, how seeds are dispersed and the life cycle of a plant. We will also be growing our own plants.

French

We are going to be learning basic greetings, days of the week and counting to 20.

PE

This term our PE sessions take place on **Wednesdays** and **Fridays**. We are looking at hockey skills and athletics this term.



PSHCE

In PSHCE this half term we are looking at economic wellbeing. This will include learning about the value of money, where it comes from and what we can do with our money including saving.

Computing



In computing we will be learning about programming and coding using Scratch.

Maths

This half term we will be focussing on number, time, data handling including looking at bar graphs and measurement including mass, length and capacity. The children will continue to use their times tables (2, 3, 5 and 10) and improving their mental and written methods.



Art and DT

This half term will focus on Design Technology where the children will learn about and make their own moving vehicle.



RE

Our theme for RE is Hinduism, where we will be learning about Hindu Gods, Hindu temples and Hindu dress.

Music

This half term we will be focussing on the composer John Williams alongside whole school singing.



Geography

This half term in Geography we are going to be learning about Katie Morag and the Isle of Struay.

Spellings will be handed out every Friday and will be tested the following Friday. **Homework** is due each Friday. Your child should choose an activity to complete from the homework web each week.

Reading books need to be brought to school each day. Please encourage your child to read at home every day for at least 15 minutes.
